If you have already made a Will, you can still leave a bequest to CPRE Norfolk by using this Codicil form. Please make sure that you sign this form in the presence of two witnesses. The witnesses must also then sign the form in your presence. Witnesses must not be named as beneficiaries in your will or be partners of beneficiaries.

In order to ensure the codicil ties in fully with your original Will, please send the completed form to your solicitor. **The codicil must be kept with your Will and any other codicil forms.** Never write on or mark any legal documents once they have been completed as they could be invalidated. Seek legal advice if you wish to change your original Will or revoke any subsequent codicils.

CPRE Norfolk will plant a tree in your memory, as a thank you for every bequest that we receive – a beautiful, growing testimony of your generosity and support.

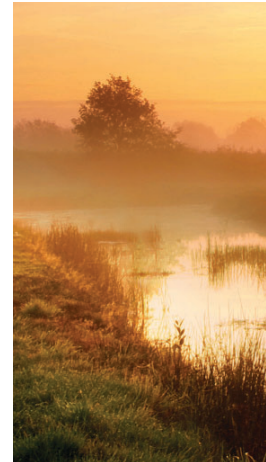
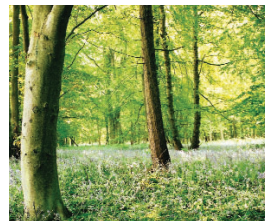

Understanding Wills and codicils

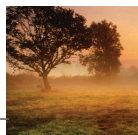
Drawing up a Will is the only way of ensuring that the assets and possessions you have worked for in life can be passed on exactly as you wish. Should you die without a Will, the State will handle your finances and your loved ones and favourite charities may get nothing. It is important to be guided by a solicitor when making a Will to ensure you have all the information you need and your subsequent instructions are clearly and legally defined.

Amending an existing Will in order to leave a gift to CPRE Norfolk can be done easily and economically by using a codicil. This legal document simply makes a further bequest of your choice in addition to the instructions of your original Will. Please complete the codicil form overleaf if you would like to leave CPRE Norfolk a gift, then send the form to your solicitor to be kept with your Will, keeping a copy for your own records.

You can use a Will or codicil to leave beneficiaries a designated sum of money (pecuniary legacy); a percentage of your estate (residual legacy) or a specific bequest (such an item of value or property).
