

CPRE NORFOLK AWARDS 2018

Information for all Applicants

The CPRE Norfolk Awards is the Awards scheme of the Norfolk Branch of the Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE Norfolk). CPRE Norfolk is a registered charity and a membership organisation, which campaigns for the protection and enhancement of the Norfolk countryside.

The CPRE Norfolk Awards scheme was launched in 1979 to recognise significant achievements in buildings and landscape. It is one of the longest running Awards schemes in the county and to date almost 500 projects have been given Awards. The Awards have been refreshed and revived for 2018 to reflect our major campaign focus 'A Vision for Norfolk' www.v4n.org.uk which looks at the challenges to our County over the next several years and proposes common-sense solutions which encourage sustainable growth and benefit all of us.

The Categories

1. Green Build Award

We are looking for projects which:

- Build sustainable living and communities
- Reduce energy, carbon and water usage and lead on creating more of a circular waste stream
- Use local labour/suppliers and materials, including recycled/re-used materials
- Show a creative and imaginative approach to revival and regeneration including sensitive development of brownfield sites and/or featuring under-utilised buildings
- Sit comfortably in their surroundings and/or blend in with the local vernacular

2. Thriving Countryside Award

We are looking for projects which:

- Demonstrate a countryside or farming initiative designed to protect an integral area of Norfolk countryside long-term
- Enable that area of Norfolk countryside to be economically viable
- Offer new or increased enjoyable access to that area of Norfolk countryside
- Promote and interpret that landscape's characteristics and biodiversity
- Engage a wide section of the community, broadening participation and widening understanding of the countryside

3. Engaged Youth Award

We are looking for projects which:

- Demonstrate a schools or youth educational or practical project engaging young people in shaping our rural environment for the future
- Are designed in part or in whole by young people
- Enhance the wellbeing of young people over the long-term
- Encourage new forms of appreciating nature, and living or working in the countryside
- Engage and work within the education system to foster a new approach to caring for the environment and for communities

4. Successful Campaign Award

We are looking for projects which:

- Demonstrate campaigning involving a large section of the community and its support
- Improve the environment and liveability of that community
- Break new ground in promoting best practice sustainable rural living
- Are inspiring and replicable elsewhere
- Have helped to change perception and/or behaviour by the local community or local authority

All projects/campaigns must have been started or completed within the last three years (to the end of August 2018).

The Application Process

All applications must be received by **1pm on Friday 31st August 2018**. Late applications will not be considered.

The Judging Process and Prizes

After the closing deadline, the judges will meet to shortlist projects and applicants will be notified by **Friday 28th September 2018** whether shortlisted or not. All shortlisted applicants will be invited to a prize ceremony at The Hostry, Norwich Cathedral on the evening of **Monday 19th November 2018** when the winners for each category will be announced.

Three projects will be shortlisted in each category. Judges will visit, by arrangement, all shortlisted projects. All project visits will be completed by 28th September. The winning project in each category will receive a commemorative plaque; all shortlisted projects will receive a framed certificate.

The Judging Panel

A judging panel for each Award category is appointed by the Trustees of CPRE Norfolk and authorised to make Awards on behalf of the branch. There are normally three judges for each category who bring a mixture of personal and professional experience. At least one trustee of CPRE Norfolk will sit on each judging panel and the panel is overseen by a Chair of Judges, who is the President of CPRE Norfolk.
