2. REGISTER YOUR SCHOOL OR YOUTH GROUP

Please register online to confirm your participation and receive your Teacher Resource Pack, promotional poster, and project support.

The form will take less than 5 minutes to complete and asks for:

- School/youth group name
- Contact person & role
- Email & phone number
- Award category (Showcase, Engagement, or both)
- Brief outline of your planned or existing project

Once registered, you'll receive:

- Confirmation of your participation with contact information should you have any issues or questions.
- Optional invitation to our October–November online Q&A sessions
- Updates and reminders throughout the year

3. PROJECT INSPIRATION

Here are some ideas to inspire your students:

- Create a wildlife or pollinator garden
- Run a litter-picking campaign or waste awareness week
- Build bug hotels, hedgehog houses, or bird boxes
- Plant native trees or establish a seed-saving programme
- Start a school eco-club with a countryside focus
- Record local wildlife through photography, drawing or creative writing
- Launch a student campaign around countryside access or clean air
- Collaborate with local farms, green groups, or environmental charities



4. CURRICULUM LINKS

These projects link naturally to many subjects:

- Science habitats, food chains, ecosystems, biodiversity, climate
- Geography land use, sustainability, fieldwork, local environment
- English persuasive writing, speeches, creative storytelling, reporting
- Citizenship/PSHE active citizenship, teamwork, values in action
- Art & Design nature-inspired artwork, upcycling, posters
- **Design & Technology** wildlife homes, model building, materials reuse

They also support Ofsted's personal development, enrichment, and student voice priorities.

5. PROJECT TIMELINE & CHECKLIST

- September 2025 Register and start planning
- Autumn Term Project planning and idea generation
- October Mid Term Registration closes
- Spring Term Project delivery and documentation
- Prior to May Half Term (22nd) Final submission of entries
- June July 2026 Judging & celebration visits

Consider using a simple diary, logbook or display board to record progress.

6. TOP TIPS FOR TEACHERS

- Let students lead this builds ownership and engagement
- Embed the project into your existing curriculum where possible
- Make it visible use displays, newsletters, assemblies or blogs
- Celebrate each stage progress deserves recognition
- Reach out to local community contacts or conservation groups

- Q: Can we enter both categories?
 - o **A**: Yes you're welcome to submit one or both types of projects.
- **Q**: What if our project is small?
 - A: That's fine! We welcome projects of all sizes and formats.
- Q: What format can we use to submit?
 - $\circ \quad \textbf{A} \hbox{: Written summaries, photos, videos, and student presentations are all great.}$
- Q: Will CPRE Norfolk help us?
 - \circ $\,$ $\,$ A: Yes you'll have access to ideas, email support, and optional Q&A sessions.
- Q: How many students can attend the prize trip if we win?
 - A: The prize is typically for a small group (e.g. up to 10 students) involved in the project. We may also offer an on-site workshop as a flexible alternative.

8. CONSENT PROCESS - MEDIA & PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT

To celebrate your school's achievements, CPRE Norfolk may share photos, videos, or student work in our communications, including our website, social media, press releases, and printed materials.

Participating schools are responsible for ensuring appropriate consent is in place for all children featured in submissions or at award events. Many schools have existing consent processes, if not, CPRE Norfolk can provide a simple template for you to adapt.



Please ensure:

- Any students without consent are not photographed or clearly identifiable
- Your school retains signed consent forms for its records
- CPRE Norfolk is notified if any media restrictions apply to your school's entry
